The sisters found it difficult to accept such a life.

But they had each other... and their "noise" eventually became a story of solidarity, sharing and resistance. And this story continues today.

*The word "family" derives from the greek words "οίκος" (=house) + "γίνομαι" (=to become). It is therefore the place where we learn what and how we should be in order to exist in any society. It is the first stage of the social formation and often mirrors the societies. Thus, in a patriarchal society we learn in the family how to behave as a "woman", the do's and don'ts and, of course, what is the destiny of a woman.
